One college has prepared a detailed and exhausted data base of the students who come from who come from rural areas. After a long experience, we found that the students who come from rural areas have different kinds of needs, problems and difficulties. They come from the area where gender discrimination, class discrimination, and caste discrimination is more that that found in urban area. They commute between their houses and the college by bus and this has brought many problems. We have prepared a data base that include their names, profession of guardian, annual income, number of family members, caste, category, numbers of graduate family members, distance between their village to college, mode of transport, the subjects they are good in, the subjects they are weak in, the social vices they are suffering from, etc.

These details give us ideas how to treat these students. We classified these lot into many small groups based on the subjects they are weak in we have found some donors who can donate for the books. We have prepared a list of the students who are aspired for higher goals like UPSC, IIM, etc. They are guided by the scholars who have expertise over it. Dr. Rahul Ravalia, on associate professor of our college

meets these students at least once in a semester and discuss with them their problems informally such meetings occur frequently and the teachers try to know the needs of the students in spite of our limitations, we try our best to help these students. This exercise resulted into a very good reputation of our college, and of only college, and it is found that the students who live in the villages around Rajkot mostly prefer our college. We have started to pay attention in preparing these students for various competitive exams, we send the Career Counseling and Development Centers of Saurashtra University.

❖	Curriculum Development- It is the patron university that decides the curriculum. But out of 10, 3 of our teachers are the chairman of the study boards, and others are members. They actively participate in the meetings regarding syllabus design and play roles in it. We continuously get feedback from the stake golders, especially the ex-students and now entrpeanaeures. This makes us aware of the market demands.-
❖	Teaching and Learning- We run extra classes for the slow learners and our mentor system is helpful to find out the problems of the students in learning. Three of our teachers have developed modules to teach the students on screen and one teacher has its own blog of language to provide the studennts language material.
❖	Examination and Evaluation- Our university has two tyre evaluation. External exams-70 marks and internal exams-30 marks. The internal exams are conducted by college. We give two assignments to the students each carrying 10 marks and an mcq test of 10 marks. The assignment and mcq is chcked by the subject teacher and the students are informed about their marks and other problems.
